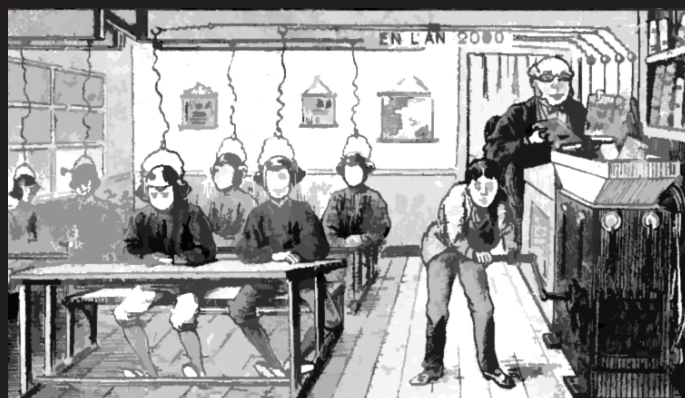
You are in an open learning Ireland. What would you like to do?

What will you do?



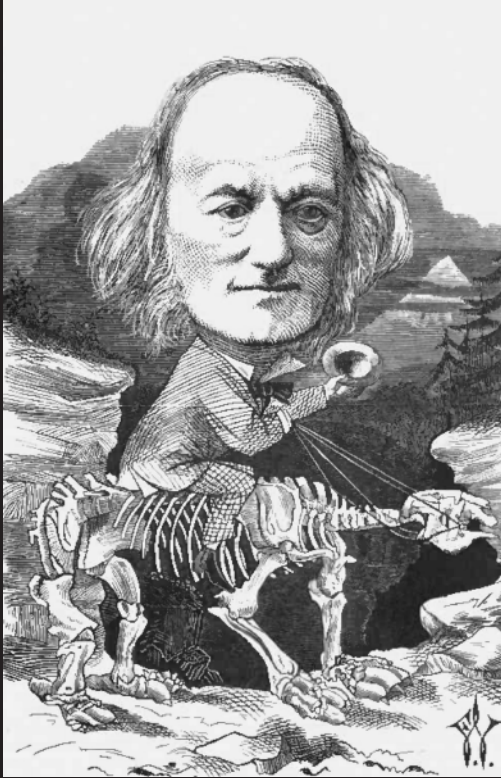

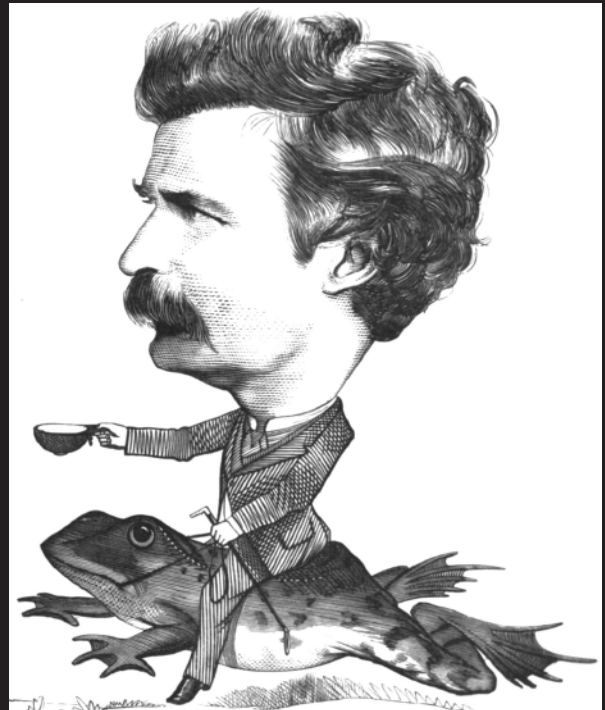
What will you do?

‘SET UP FOR TALK’

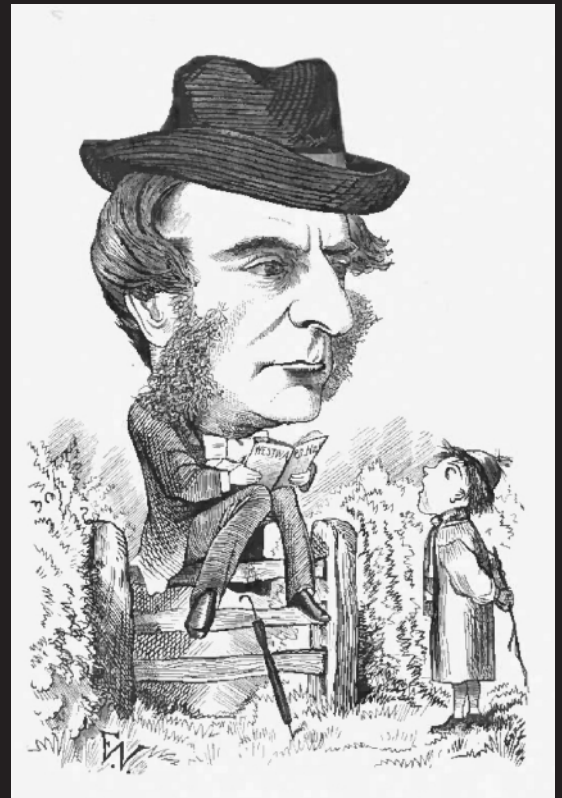

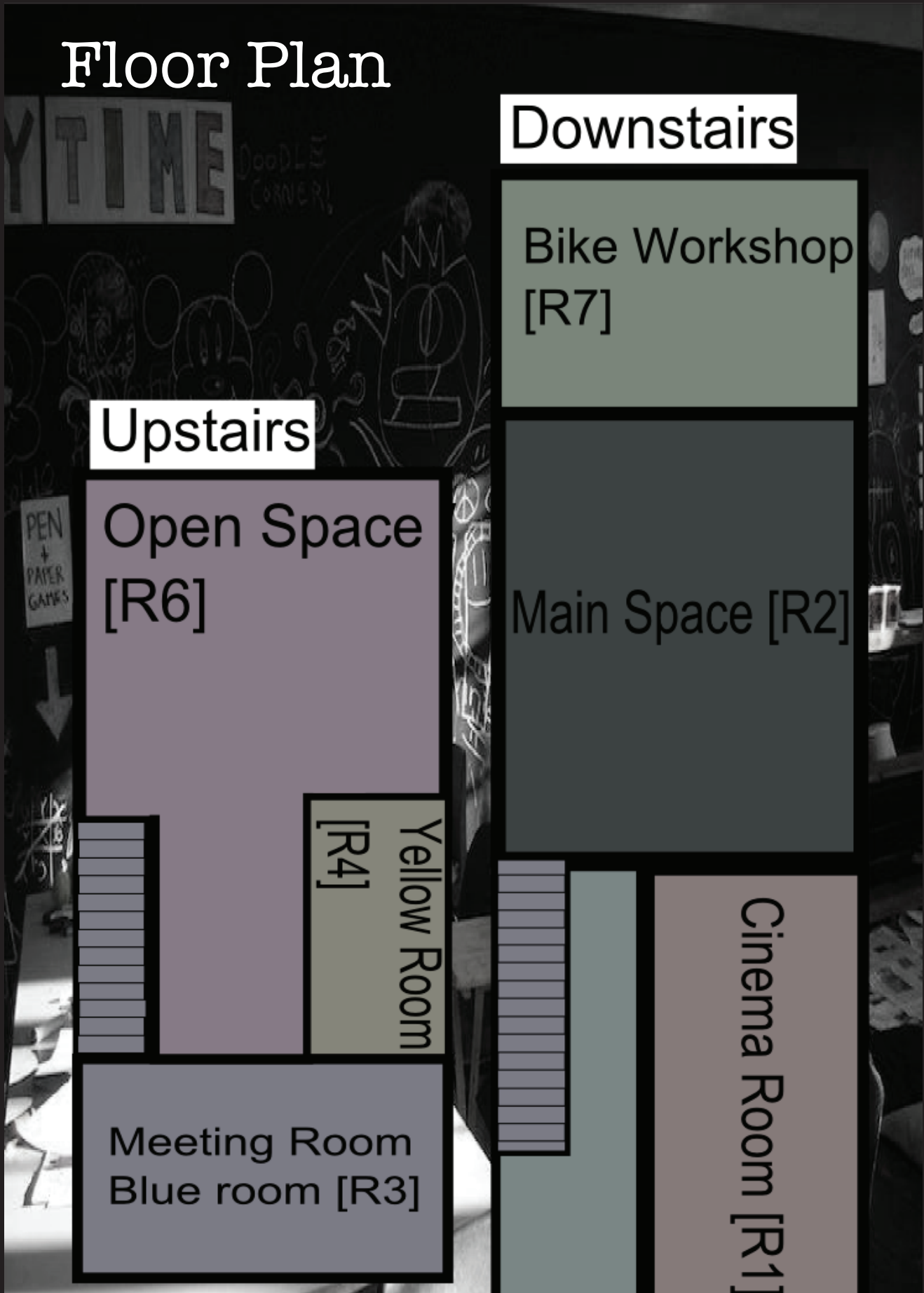
